- **1. Call to order and roll call:** Chairman Abler called the meeting to order at 9 AM. Members present were Terry Abler, Mayor Don Pohlman, Diane Gilson, Donna Hahn, Mel Blanke, and Scott Flood. Also present was Tim Blakeslee, Anna Voigt and Chris Russo.
- **2. Approve November 11, 2019 Meeting Minutes:** Motion was made Pohlman/Flood to approve the minutes from November 11, 2019. A unanimous aye vote was cast. Motion carried.
- 3. Discussion of New Revolving Loan Fund Program: City Administrator / Utilities Manager explained the City has a Revolving Loan Fund Program that has gone defunct as a result of changes in state/federal guidelines. In 2019 the City was notified that it was not subject to the restrictions of the CBGD-CLOSE program. Wis. State Statues provides authority to a City to make loans for certain purposes. The RLF program is not specifically identifies as one of those. As a result, The City requests the RDA host the program, with the program being funded and managed by the City. An RDA is specifically permitted in state law to host an RLF. The City of Plymouth Finance & Personnel committee directed staff to develop the program. The RDA and Common Council Committee of the Whole reviewed the draft program. Blanke was involved in the last RLF Program and pointed out a few differences from the last program. Members asked how the program was going to get promoted. It was suggested that City Administrator / Utilities Manager Blakeslee meet with local banks to let them know about the program.
- **4. Adjournment:** Motion was made by Pohlman/Blanke to adjourn the meeting. A unanimous aye vote was cast. Motion carried.

RE: Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) Loan Request from Plymouth Industries.

Background: The City of Plymouth Revolving Loan Fund was recently reestablished by the City of Plymouth in coordination with the Plymouth Redevelopment Authority (RDA). Currently, the new RLF program has a fund balance of approximately \$2.3 Million with \$1.0 million currently available for loans. Outstanding loans are the following: ~\$20,000 from Hub Studio Café, \$500,000 from TID#4 paid back 2024, and \$750,000 from TID#5 paid back by 2028. The new Revolving Loan Fund Program is intended to meet the following objectives:

- To encourage the leveraging of new private investment into the City of Plymouth in the form of fixed asset investment, particularly in land, buildings, and fixed equipment.
- To perpetuate a positive and proactive business climate which encourages the retention and expansion of existing businesses and helps to attract desirable new businesses.
- To implement the City of Plymouth's comprehensive plan goals and objectives.
- To maintain and promote a diverse mix of employment opportunities and to minimize seasonal or cyclical employment fluctuations.
- To encourage the development and redevelopment of the historic downtown district.
- To promote new housing and commercial/industrial development and redevelopment for purposes of blight elimination and prevention as contemplated under Wis. Stat. § 66.1333.

Request: Plymouth Industries submitted a loan application in April of 2023 knowing that that the City was working on reestablishing the program (Attachment 1). Additional financial documents will be distributed at the meeting. Request Summary

- 1. Total Project Cost: \$2,668,355.71
- 2. RLF Request: \$500,000 (18% of project funding)
- 3. Private Bank Financing: \$1,000,000
- 4. Company/Investor Financing: \$1,168,355.74

Sample Loan Terms (Subject to RLF Committee Discussion and Change):

- 10-year loan with balloon payment in year 10
- 20-year amortization schedule
- Year 1-3 Interest rate at 2.85 (Rate half of Plymouth Industries construction loan).
- Year 4 Interest rate at 3.1
- Year 5 Interest rate at 3.6
- Years 6-10 Interest Rate increase 1 per year (Capped at 2 points over prime).
- Year 10 Balloon Payment
- · Personal Guarantee Required
- Collateral Business Assets
