1. When does the water rate increase go into effect?

This rate increase will go into effect on February 1, 2022

2. When will my bill reflect the rate increase?

The March bill will be the first bill reflecting the increase for February usage. The increase is on the monthly service charge, volume charge, and Public Fire Protection.

5. Why is there an increase in water rates?

As costs of materials and labor increase, the cost of providing water service eventually increases. The increase is relatively small and allows us to continue investing in the utility infrastructure that provides safe and reliable drinking water.

6. When did Plymouth Utilities last raise rates?

Electric rates have been in place since 2015, over 6 years Sanitary Sewer rates were increased 3% in 2019, 2 years ago. Water rates were last updated in 2017, over 4 years ago.

7. Did a regulatory agency approve the water rate increase?
