

Social Distancing Policy

Areas have been measured to allow for the CDC's recommended 6ft distance.

Independent work: You are welcome to come to the library to work independently. Because we are following guidelines on occupancy limits, we ask that community members try to limit their visit to one hour.

Socializing, Meeting, Collaborative Work: At this time, all meetings between members of the public who live in different households are prohibited. Members of the same household may use library facilities for collaborative work. We ask that you limit the number of members of the household that visit at one time as it affects our occupancy limit. We also ask that you try to limit your visit to one hour. Caregivers with young children must be with their children at all times to ensure they maintain social distance with others that do not live in their household. Community members are not to congregate in areas if you happen to run into a neighbor or friend while visiting the library. Exceptions may be made at the discretion for the Library Director or Manager on Duty.

Organized meeting reservations and programs: Meetings and programs that have been booked by private citizens, organizations, and associations as well as the library have been cancelled.

Groups of Youth: Plan to make library visits independently of friends. Socializing at the library is prohibited at this time.

Failure to comply with this policy may result in the suspension of library privileges.
